ELLA (WALLINGFORD) MENDENHALL, daughter of Webster Napoleon Wallingford (1843-1922) and Mary K. Pugh (1847-1911), was born on 15 Dec 1881 in Tollesboro, Lewis County, Kentucky.

She was married to **EVERETT BURTON MENDENHALL**, son of Probate Judge James M. Mendenhall (1834-1914) and Ruth Elizabeth Smith (1841-1929) on 20 Feb 1905 in Lexington, Clark County, Kansas.

In 1910, Everett and Ella were living in Millville, Shasta County, California. Between 1911 and 1920, they moved back to Clark County, Kansas.

Everett and Ella Mendenhall had six known children: JAMES W. MENDENHALL (1906-1968), MARY LOUISE (MENDENHALL) CLEAVER (1907-1989), ALPHA ELIZABETH (MENDENHALL) MOBLEY (1909-2003), JOAN IRENE "HAZEL" MENDENHALL (1912-1988), CHARLES AUGUSTINE MENDENHALL (1914-1977), and EVERETT BURTON MENDENHALL, JR. (1923-1985).

The Ashland, Clark County, Kansas post office appointed Ella as the postmaster on 6 Jan 1925.

Everett passed away in January of 1941 and Ella died on 3 Feb 1950. Burial for both was at the Highland Cemetery in Ashland, Kansas.


