## WILLIAM C. PEARCE

**WILLIAM "WILL" CREATH PEARCE**, son of Joseph Taylor "*Sweet Potato*" Pearce (*1835-1915*) and Mary Cowgill (*1835-1910*), was born 30 Nov 1872 in Peoria, Franklin County, Kansas. William's father moved the family to Garden City, Finney County, Kansas, during its early settlement days.

William married **MYRTLE DELLA BARLOW**, daughter of Albert Addison Barlow (*1833-1925*) and Frances P. Franklin (*1858-1922*), on 25 Dec 1899 in Santa Fe, Haskell County, Kansas. Myrtle was born on 5 Aug 1882 in Sedgwick County, Kansas. William and Myrtle lived in Garden City, at the same house on 8<sup>th</sup> street for many years, except when they moved to Yucaipa, San Bernardino County, California, in about 1940. They stayed only a short time and returned to Garden City. William made his living as an attorney.

William died on 13 Dec 1954, and Myrtle died in Garden City, Kansas on 15 Nov 1967. They were both buried at the Valley View Cemetery in Garden City, Finney County, Kansas.

William and Myrtle had four children:

**LINNA G. PEARCE** was born on 11 Jun 1903 in Garden City, Kansas. At the age of 26, she was working as a stenographer at her father's attorney office. She lived in Long Beach, Los Angeles County, California until the death of her husband, Glen Calvin La Moyea, on 3 Aug 1948. (He was born on 9 Sep 1891 in Illinois.) About 4 years later, Linna returned to her home state, Kansas, living there until her death on 26 Mar 1997. She died at the age of 93 years in Lakin, Kearny County, Kansas. Her burial was at the Valley View Cemetery in Garden City, Finney County, Kansas. Glen and Linna had two children, Glen Alfred La Moyea (1935-2010) and Juanita (La Moyea) Towles (1937-2015).

**MARION R. PEARCE**, born 11 Apr 1906 in Garden City, Kansas, was married to Lorraine L. Ester, daughter of Wilbur O. Ester and Gertrude Wiles, on 16 Dec 1931. They had three children; Robert M. Pearce, Phyllis L. Pearce, and James R. Pearce. Marion died on 12 Nov 1953 in Garden City. In 1955, Lorraine married again to Clarence E. McCarty. He died in 1982. Burial for Marion, Lorraine, and Clarence was at the Valley View Cemetery in Garden City, Kansas.

**GLEEWIN VERIL PEARCE** was born in 1908 and married to Max A. Brewer. Max was born on 29 Jan 1900. Gleewin died in March of 1952, and Max died in December of

1985. Burial for both was at the Valley View Cemetery in Garden City, Kansas. One son was born in their marriage, Billy Max Brewer.

**JOSEPH ADDISON PEARCE** was born on 9 Jun 1911 in Garden City, Kansas. In 1930, he was still living in Garden City and working for a dry cleaning business. In 1935, he was living in Casper, Wyoming. Census records for 1940 reveal that he had moved to Yucaipa, San Bernardino County, California, was divorced, and living with his parents. In 1942, he was working on a ranch in San Bernardino, San Bernardino County, California. Records reveal that Joseph moved back to Garden City, Kansas when his parents did. Joseph died in May of 1948 and his burial was at the Valley View Cemetery in Garden City, Kansas.
